VAN ENGELEN FAMILY

Jos van Engelen b. 1912 – priest of The Missionaries of the Wounded Heart of Jesus – Frans's brother.

FRANS VAN ENGELEN b. 1916 – Father of Anneke – well-respected and successful notary.
MARIJKE MARTENS b. 1922 – Mother of Anneke – isolated in London during World War 2, attended university and achieved a BA.

ANNEKE b. July 1948 – Nienke Nijboer's best friend – very pretty, golden blond, blue-eyed, starlet height of 5' 6" or 168 cms, slight build, usually the prettiest girl in the room – outgoing, likes attention, and is not above using her looks to get what she wants.

DANNY WILLIAMSON, b. June 1945 – Ronnie Newell's friend – lives at Chatsworth – tall, handsome and rugged – has a series of girlfriends, including Jannie, whom he meets on a business trip to London in September 1966, a relationship which infuriates Gerda van den Donker.

LUUK RIETVELD (b. 1945) begins university in September 1966 – 22 years in 1967 – worked for 1 year in father's business – father builder – spent 2 years in a major seminary in Noord-Brabant – enrolls at Amsterdam University in politics and law in September 1966 – fair complexion, light brown hair, solid, rugged, manly 5 ft 10 ins, moderate looking, untidy, shy and

studious but viciously outspoken on religion, politics and society – gives the impression he has personality problems.

Goedemorgen – Good morning (formal)

Goeiemorgen – Good morning (everyday)

Goedemiddag – Good Afternoon (formal)

Goeiemiddag – Good afternoon (everyday)

Goedenavond – Good evening

Plein – square

Straat – street

Singel – moat or boulevard

Lieverd, schat – darling or dear

Goede hemel – good heavens (an exclamation)

Allemachtig – lit. almighty (an exclamation like ‘my goodness’ or ‘good lord’)

Kasteel Zaligheid – Castle Bliss or Castle of Heavenly Bliss

Meneer – Mr or sir

Mevrouw – Mrs or madam

Juffrouw – Miss

Stroopwafel – Sweet syrupy cookie or biscuit

Bolus – a syrupy pastry, specialty of Zeeland

Notes on spelling and pronunciation

Dutch spelling deviates in some respects from English. The ‘ee’ in the name ‘Cees’ is a pure vowel sound and approximates the ‘a’ in ‘case’; ‘c’ is usually pronounced as ‘s’, but in the case of the name ‘Cees’, it is pronounced as a ‘k’. Cees is thus roughly pronounced as ‘Kayse’; the ‘ij’ that appears in Marijke (and many other Dutch words) is equivalent to ‘ay’ in English; ‘v’ is usually pronounced as an ‘f’; ‘j’ is pronounced as a ‘y’; ‘w’ is pronounced like ‘v’. Here are the main Dutch names in the story, spelt *roughly* the English way:

Cees van den Donker: Kayse fun den donker

Zeeland: Zayland

Jos van Engelen: Yos fun Engelen

Jannie de Kam: Yunnie de kum;

Anneke: Ann-e-ke

Marijke: Maray-ke ('ke' is short)
Lodewijk: Lo-de-vayk
Nienke: Neen-ke
Nijboer: Nayboor
Katja van Amstel: Katya fun Amstel
